Breast milk benefits babies By Michaela Pershe

A mother's milk is one of the most effective and simplest methods of nourishing your baby. Formula does not have nearly the amount of optimal nutrition found in mother's breast milk. Breast milk is unique to every mother and infant because it provides specific nutrients and vitamins just for a baby. Human breast milk is a live substance with immunological and antiinflammatory properties that protect against many illnesses and diseases for both mothers and babies and fluctuates in nutritional properties to support the baby in the best possible way. Breastfeeding also helps to form a strong emotional bond between mother and baby and serves as an important factor in a baby's emotional and mental growth.

The World Health Organization recognizes the importance of breastfeeding, saying: "Breastmilk promotes sensory and cognitive development, and protects the infant against infectious and chronic diseases."

Sometimes formula is necessary for feeding your infant. If a mother is unable to produce breast milk or is uncomfortable with the process, she should not feel guilty if formula is preferred.
