"You know if you have an "oops", there is always the Plan B Pill." These words are still ringing in my ears. I'm sitting on the table in a medical provider's exam room with my new six-week-old baby in her stroller sleeping. I can't help think about how non-chalant this was said to me as if being offered a Tic-Tac.

I don't believe the provider thinks my baby or any baby is an

"oops", but it certainly irked me because it could seem to imply a baby is an "accident" or a "mistake" and we know that isn't true—ever. However, in today's society, many see babies exactly this way.

Unfortunately, obtaining medications that alter a woman's physiology to prevent a pregnancy or "discard pregnancy tissue" has become easier and more common than ever. Often times, instead of seeking assistance to raise their baby, the first question is, "where can I go to get rid of my pregnancy?"

After some reflection of my first year as Director and many conversations with our volunteers and board members, it helped solidify my goal for this year: reach moms sooner in their pregnancies to offer hope, encouragement and support...as well as to let moms know that no baby is an oops.

New Eldvertising Campaign

Over the past year, our volunteers have been noticing more and more moms coming to us at the end stages of their pregnancies and shortly after they have given birth. While we are **absolutely** here to serve those moms, we want to **reach them earlier** in their pregnancies so that we can offer them maximum support and assistance. So after some discussion, the board has decided to begin **university campus** advertising!

With strategically placed advertisements, we are hoping to reach moms who are **abortion vulnerable** as well as to **create more awareness** that Birthright is here to help them.

Birthright volunteers call their clients weekly to determine what resources or assistance they may need, or just to talk. When women come to us at the end of their pregnancies, we can only offer so much. But if they come to us sooner, we are able to walk with them throughout their pregnancy and build a relationship. You can see how important it is to reach these moms as soon as possible.


